CERT & Incident Command System

The Incident Command System (ICS) is the system used by emergency response agencies to manage emergency operations. When a CERT activates, it becomes part of the incident management system. Basic ICS structure for CERT is established by the person who arrives first on the scene. ICS structure is based around five functional areas.

<u>Command:</u> Set the incident objectives, strategies, and priorities, and has overall responsibility for the incident.

<u>Operations:</u> Establishes tactics and directs all operational resources.

<u>Planning</u>: Supports the incident action planning process by tracking resources.

<u>Logistics:</u> Arranges for resources and needed services to support achievement of the incident objectives.

<u>Finance:</u> Monitors costs related to the incident. Provides accounting, procurement, time recording, and cost analyses.

CARBON MONOXIDE SAFETY

More than 150 people in the Unites States die every year from accidental nonfirerelated carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning associated with consumer products.

Because CO is odorless, colorless, and otherwise undetectable to the human senses, people may not know that they are being exposed. The initial symptoms of low to moderate CO poisoning are similar to the flu (but without the fever). They include:

- Headache
- Fatigue
- Shortness of breath
- Nausea
- **Dizziness**

On-scene Management

Effective emergency scene management requires the formulation goals and tactical objectives to do the most good for the greatest number while maintaining the safety of rescue personnel.

Remember that rescuer safety is paramount.

The first question to ask is, "Is it safe for the CERT volunteers to attempt the rescue?" The answer to this question is based on the degree of damage:

HEAVY – No do not enter **MODERATE**– Yes but only quick rescues LIGHT – Yes, but continue to size up
